As a native of Angela City, I'm proud my city has become a more and more popular tourist destination year after year. Cathy: Hello. Welcome to our talk show. This is Cathy Jackson. Today we'll talk about wild animals as pets. We have invited Dr. Robert Jones, an animal doctor who works at the Park Animal Hospital, and Dr. William Baker, a biologist at Nature College. Let's start with you, Dr. Jones. Some people say that wild animals are too dangerous to keep in the home, but (I). Why?

Dr. Jones: There are a lot of wrong stories about these animals as pets. ① When people keep wild animals in the right way, they are not dangerous at all. Last week a woman brought a ball python to my hospital. It was as cute as a baby cat and really friendly. Last month I visited a man who lived with a lion for its health check. These days, monitor lizards are also popular.

Cathy : Thank you, Dr. Jones. Now, Dr. Baker, what do you think?

Dr. Baker: I don't agree. First, many of these animals are injured when they are caught. It's a really terrible experience for them. Also, they don't always have enough space to run and move around in. (II). And, if we want to talk about health problems, I have to tell you that some wild animals carry terrible diseases.

Cathy : Dr. Jones, what can people do for both their pets and their families to keep them in good health?

Dr. Jones: Well, there are some important things that people have to do when they keep wild animals as pets. Most of these animals have special needs. Look at this. This shows the "Special Needs for Popular Wild Animals and Humans." If people understand their needs and give them the things which they want, people can have a lot of fun with them.

I still wonder why Japanese people don't hesitate to be naked in front of others. I see Japanese people bowing when they greet. To me, they seem to keep a distance from each other in most of their daily lives. While they don't seem to have physical contact, they enjoy talking naked with strangers. I think ① it is very strange.




