My teacher, Ms. Nelson, told us about the manners at a dinner party.

If the invitation says 7:30 p.m., it doesn't mean you eat at 7:30. ① Don't come at 7 p.m. Your host will be surprised because they won't be ready. Don't knock on the door exactly at 7:30 p.m. In Britain and America, it's polite to be 10 to 15 minutes late. ② If you're more than 15 to 20 minutes late, call your host. Then the host won't worry and can adjust the cooking plans.

Don't open your napkin right when you sit down if the food is already served. Follow the host or the special guest. Larger napkins are folded in two, and smaller napkins are left unfolded. Don't put the napkin in your shirt. After the meal, put the napkin on the table to the left of the bread plate.


Most people know that if the table is set, you use the cutlery, such as forks, knives, and spoons, from the outside. But American dining settings sometimes don't follow this rule. In English homes, cutlery, including a small spoon or fork for pudding, isn't put above the table setting. All cutlery for pudding is set both to the left and right of the plate. 3 Buckingham Palace now puts all pudding cutlery above the plate. The spoon points left and the fork points right. This is more recognized around the world and makes guests comfortable.

In formal dining, research how to eat foods if you expect to eat with important people, especially if you know the menu before. A, with mussels, after picking out one with your fork, use its empty shell to pick out the rest. A finger bowl should be provided to clean your fingers.

If you're not sure how to eat a dish, watch what the smart guests are doing and copy them. Dining manners are important, but don't worry too much about them. Remember that the main goal is to enjoy the meal.
